PSC breaks ground on new residence hall

Potomac State College held its groundbreaking ceremony for the new Residence Hall on June 20.

The new Residence Hall will living facilities, a dining area and kitchen, laundry facilities fitness center, a video game room, and a 74-seat theater.

The new residence hall will contain approximately 355 beds, and a controlled entrance to student living area.

Half of the residence will contain three floors and the other half of the building will contain four floors.

The total project budget for this new Residence Hall is \$19 million. The New Residence Hall will be opening Fall Semester 2007.
